ELECTIONS

The 2022 midterm elections solidified Illinois as a solidly blue state with Democrats winning big up and down the ticket. Democrats benefited from a huge fundraising advantage as well as the newly drawn congressional and legislative districts which were crafted under their control.

Democrats easily swept all statewide offices winning by double digit margins in every race. U.S. Senator Tammy Duckworth won re-election and Governor JB Pritzker, along with Lt Governor Juliana Stratton, won a second term. Attorney General Kwame Raoul, Comptroller Susana Mendoza and Treasurer Michael Frehrichs all won reelection.

Democrat Alexi Giannoulias will replace long-standing Secretary of State Jesse White who did not seek reelection.



At the Congressional level, Democrats picked up one seat increasing their majority to 14D – 3 R. Democrats also maintained their majority on the Illinois Supreme Court with Democrats winning both of the contested Supreme Court races increasing their majority to 5D-2R.

Democrats maintained their supermajority status in the Illinois General Assembly. While some races remain too close to call, the House Democrats are expected to increase their supermajority to an unprecedented 77D-41R when all votes are counted. While Senate Democrats are projected to lose one or two incumbents, they will still hold a 39D – 20R supermajority.

Following these losses, House Republican Leader Jim Durkin announced that he will not seek another term as House Republican Leader. In his statement Durkin said "It's time for the Illinois Republican Party to rebuild with new leaders who can bring independents back to the party that are needed to bring change to the state."

Some races remain too close to call and the outcome of some races may change as Early Voting and Vote by Mail ballots are counted over the course of the next two weeks.

Constitutional officers will be sworn into office on Monday, January 9th. The 103rd General Assembly will be sworn into office on Wednesday, January 11th.

Constitutional Amendment:

The fate of a proposed amendment to the Illinois Constitution remains too close to call. Approval of the measure requires 3/5ths vote on the question or a majority of those voting in the election.

Illinois Voters were asked to vote on [an amendment](#) to the Illinois constitution which would guarantee workers have the “fundamental right to organize and to bargain collectively through representatives of their own choosing for the purpose of negotiating wages, hours, and working conditions, and to protect their economic welfare and safety at work”.

Statewide Races:

Democrats won all statewide races.

Supreme Court:

There were two contested elections for seats on the Supreme Court. Democrats prevailed in both races.

Congress:

Illinois lost one Congressional seat following the decennial census. Despite the loss of a seat, Democrats increased their majority to 14-3.

Congressman Sean Casten (D) survived a strong challenge from Orland Park Mayor Keith Pekau (R). In the 13th Congressional District, Nikki Budzinski (D), a former aid to Governor JB Pritzker, defeated Regan Derring (R) in this newly drawn district. In the 17th Congressional District, Eric Sorenson (D) defeated Esther Joy King (R) to replace Congresswoman Cherri Bustos who did not seek reelection.

Congressman Jesus “Chuy” Garcia easily won reelection. It is widely speculated that he will announce his candidacy for Chicago Mayor in the coming days.

Illinois Senate:

Although Democrats may lose at most two seats, they are still expected to maintain their supermajority status with 39D – 20 R. Republican Erica Harriss defeated appointed Senator Kris Tharp in the seat formerly held by Rachelle Crowe. Currently, Republican Patrick Sheehan holds a 68 vote lead over Senator Michael Hastings (D).

Appointed Senator Doris Turner (D) defeated a strong challenge from appointed Representative Sandy Hamilton (R).

Illinois House:

This is the first election cycle under newly elected House Speaker Chris Welch. Despite losing one incumbent, House Democrats appear to have picked up 4 seats increasing their supermajority to 77D – 41R.

In the night’s biggest upset, Republican Kevin Schmidt defeated Representative LaToya Greenwood in this East St. Louis district. Republican incumbents Chris Bos and Keith Wheeler both lost. Republican Representative Deanne Mazzochi is currently losing to her opponent by less than 200 votes.

Democrats picked up three open seats. Democrat Mary Beth Canty defeated Michele Hunter (R) to replace retiring Representative Tom Morrison (R). Democrat Sharon Chung defeated Republican Scott Preston. Harry Benton defeated Republican Michelle Smith (R) to replace Representative Mark Batinick who did not seek reelection.

Please reach out to newly elected legislators and ask if they will be supportive of our issues. Time to make some new friends!

Elections have consequences, watch for the hold on gas taxes to be removed and other revenue enhancements.

April brings another round of elections in our local governments. Candidates are circulating petitions and will be filing soon. Please help those candidates get on the ballot, there occasionally is a shortage. Your biggest item on your property tax bill are schools. Find out who is running and support those that will be fiscally responsible with YOUR dollars.

Treasurer: Mark Del Monaco

November?! One month until end-of-year?! I've been DuKane ABATE's Treasurer since January and, if you weren't at the meeting, I was officially nominated to the position of Treasurer for the next 2-year term, it was seconded, and I accepted. Although we're kinda a laid-back group, I take this position seriously. For one, we have a great team on the board, and we have a great membership group! There's no better way to follow that than to try your absolute best. And, of course, you can't mess around with the money. Every transaction throughout the year needs to be identified, accounted for, and associated with a tax category for our 501c4 not-for-profit organization.



To that end, my top priority for the year was to ensure our three accounts, General, Toy & Food Run, and Downed Rider, all balance with the bank (and remember we transitioned from West Suburban Bank to Old Second Bank this year), and that every transaction is linked to the appropriate 990 tax reporting category for income and expense. The mechanism to make this happen is 100% complete in an Excel workbook. I simply verify that every credit/debit bank transaction balances, provide a "purpose" statement for each transaction including the context of all debit card purchases and bank deposits, ensure all transactions from SQUARE are accounted for (the credit card tool that attaches to smartphones and tablets), validate we were paid from on-line ticket sales from EventBright, and then select a 990 category for each from a "drop down" pick-list. A separate 990 worksheet scans through the three, account worksheet 990 columns and sums the 990 categories into the form needed by Paul Truax at Abate-IL for his final accumulation and tax reporting. When I finish balancing December, our accounting for 2022 will be complete.

For 2023, this mechanism will be simplified by collapsing the three accounts into just the one General account. Then, similar to the 990 column, I will add a column for budget category (Toy & Food Run and Downed Rider are really budgets with no need for a separate bank account). Every Event or Activity we do, e.g. Bolero Bowling, Bikini Bike Wash, Toy & Food, Downed Rider, etc.) will become a budget area. I will work with the Board to plan the 2023 budget spreading our account value over our Event and Activity plan for 2023, reserving a reasonable percentage for changes. As 2023 unfolds we'll compare our actual income & expenses vs. our budgeted income & expenses and have a much better-informed idea of what we can do for 2024. Easy-peasy, tedious, but not rocket science.

For the remainder of this year and 1Q23, that's my agenda for DuKane Abate.

I want to wish everyone a very Happy Thanksgiving and wonderfully Merry Christmas. Do something nice for a person you do not know.
